BEAVER ADAPTATIONS



two coats of fur: one for warmth, one for staying dry



tail acts as a danger-alarm, rudder, kickstand, and fatstore for winter





webbed

webbed back feet for swimming teeth are strong in the front and softer in the back so they sharpen themselves as they chew on wood

beavers can hold their breath underwater for up to 15 minutes an extra set of lips close behind teeth, so beavers can carry sticks underwater



DID YOU KNOW?

Beavers use sticks and logs to build dams across streams, creating ponds and lush, green areas called **wetlands**.



These wetlands become important **habitat** for wildlife. A habitat is a home for plants and animals that has everything they need to survive.



A baby beaver is called a **kit**. Kits stay with their family for 2-3 years before they move to habitat nearby to start their own family



Beavers don't eat fish! They only eat plants and their favorites include willow, aspen, and cottonwood.
